# New York City Building Permit Report

## Permit Volume Overview

NYC DOB NOW issued **13,466 building permits** this month across all five boroughs. Of these, **9,752 (72.4%)** were initial filings — new work starting fresh — while the remainder were renewals of existing permits. General construction led all work types with **3,529 permits**, followed by plumbing at **1,844** and mechanical systems at **1,323**. Solar installations continue to be a growing category with **377 permits** this month.

## Activity by Borough

**Manhattan** led all five boroughs this month with **5,093 permits** (37.8% of citywide total). NYC's permit activity is spread across a uniquely diverse construction landscape — from high-rise commercial towers in Manhattan to residential conversions and new construction in the outer boroughs.

## Project Valuation

The combined estimated job cost of all permitted work this month totaled **\$5067.1M**, with an average declared job cost of **\$446,400**. New York City consistently ranks as the highest-cost construction market in the United States, driven by dense urban conditions, labor costs, and complex logistics. These figures represent applicant-declared valuations at the time of permit filing and span residential, commercial, and infrastructure work.

## Top Neighborhoods

**Midtown-Times Square** was the most active neighborhood this month with **710 permits** (5.3% of citywide total). The table below lists the six most active Neighborhood Tabulation Areas (NTAs) — NYC's standard geographic unit below the borough level — giving contractors a precise view of where work is concentrated.
